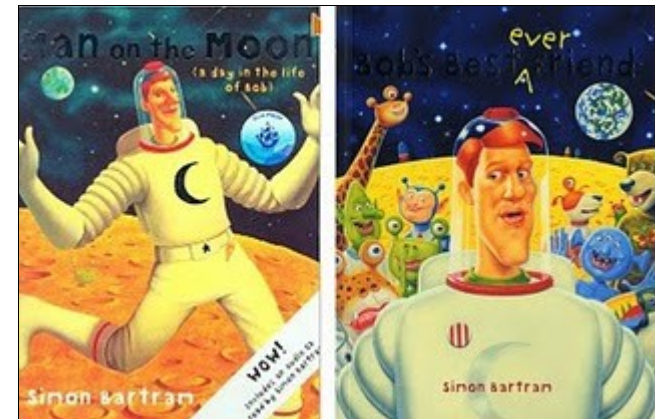


About Author Simon Bartram

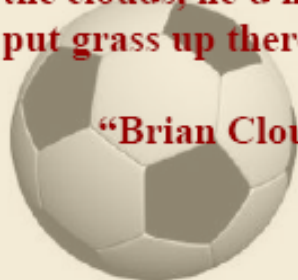
